## **2023 Ornaments**

GKS is happy to present **two** pewter ornaments for 2023. The first one is of the Guilford Institute, and the other is the Acadian House. The Guilford Institute was built by Sarah Griffing in 1855 as a private school, it later became the home of The Shoreline Times. The building was converted to condominiums in 2012.

The Acadian House was built by Joseph Clay in 1670. It is one of Connecticut's oldest surviving houses. The house has its name because a family of Acadians from Grand Pre, Nova Scotia was sheltered there by the Town of Guilford following their deportation from Nova Scotia in 1755. The ornaments will be sold at the Hartmann Group, the Museums, the GKS Website, Sachem's Card and Party. The price is \$20 per ornament. Ornaments will also be sold around town during the Holiday season.
